- Resident focused: The community's main goal is providing a quality, meaningful and secure life for all residents.
- Financial assistance: Most communities offer a benevolence fund to ensure residents can continue to live at the community, even if they outlive their resources through no fault of their own.
- Local control: All decisions and the direction of the community are handled by a dedicated local board of directors.
- Financial benefits: A not-for-profit Life Plan Community will receive favorable tax credits and exemptions as well as preferred pricing on goods and services. This helps reduce operating costs and result in lower, more sustainable and predictable monthly fees for all residents.
